- Much of West Auckland is rural and remote so hiring a car is highly recommended.
- Guided tours are also top notch and generally leave central Auckland to explore beaches, wineries and galleries. • The Waitākere Ranges Regional Park saturates the western
- region with native forest, over 250km of walking tracks and waterfalls.
- Kauri trees are some of the world's largest but they're under threat from an untreatable Kauri Dieback Disease.
- A number of tracks in the Waitākere Ranges have been closed to help prevent the spread of Kauri Dieback Disease. Check what's open at aucklandcouncil.govt.nz/protectkauri.
- Surfers love the powerful waves at Bethells Beach and Muriwai, but swimming is not advised due to unpredictable rips.

roaring waves LINTAMED BEACHES

trung like black pearls, the wildly beautiful beaches that line the coast are what the region is best known for. Wandering along the black sand (shoes may be necessary on hot days) and splashing around in shallow surf are quintessential summer experiences in this neck of the woods. The big surf here is powerful and spectacular, but only experienced surfers should attempt to ride it. Swimmers must always swim between the red and yellow flags.

WHATIPU

Whatipu is windswept, moody and memorable. Swimming isn't advised, but with vast dunes, caves and historic Māori sites, there's still plenty to explore. Access is via an unsealed road.

KAREKARE Dramatic Karekare has

inspired many filmmakers and was most notably used in Jane Campion's The Piano.

PIHA

This popular beach has some of the best surf in Auckland. Take a surf lesson or explore the rocky edges, and refuel at the Piha Café afterwards.

BEACHES **TE HENGA (BETHELLS)**

BEST

More sheltered than some of the other west coast beaches, this spot makes for a great day out with its surf beach and lagoon (swimming in the lagoon is not recommended). There's also huge sand dunes at nearby Lake Wainamu to explore.

MURIWAI

With strong surf pounding onto a long expanse of black sand, Muriwai is popular with walkers, swimmers and experienced surfers. Horse riding and surf lessons are available too. Check out the accessible mainland gannet colony at its southern end.

Although beautiful, these beaches are dangerous only swim when lifeguards are on duty and only between the red and yellow flags.

coastal gems EXPLORE NATURE

here are coastal gems all over West Auckland, and these are best explored on walks ranging rom clifftop tracks high sand to boardwalks through suburban mangroves.

TF HFNGA WALKWAY

One of the AA's 101 Must-Do's for Kiwis, this walkway runs between Te Henga (Bethells) and Muriwai and takes in rugged cliffs, lagoons, amazing sand dunes and brilliant views of the pounding surf.



PIHA'S LION ROCK

Sitting majestically between Piha and North Piha beaches watching over the thundering surf, Lion Rock is an iconic sight A steep track leads you to a high point for breathtaking views of the coastline.

For beauty and solitude, take the turn-off before Piha and take a 20-minute walk from the car park to Anawhata Beach. The track down to the beach can be steep in places but you'll be rewarded with a beautifully rugged beach minus the crowds.



MURIWAI'S GANNET COLONY

The gannet colony at Muriwai's Otakamiro Point is an easy walk from the beach. The best time to visit is between August and March when around 1200 pairs of gannets return from their ocean wanderings to nest on the clifftop.

KAURI DIEBACK

Kauri dieback disease is killing kauri trees in the Waitākere Ranges Regior Park. The closure of most tracks and the creation of protection zones helps prevent the spread, but anyone using the park can play their part to save kauri. Please respect these guidelines

vhen visiting Always make sure your shoes, tyres and equipment are cleaned to help material before and after visiting kauri forest.

SECRET SPOTS LAKE WAINAMU,

TE HENGA/BETHELLS BEACH

This is a hidden gem unknown even to most Aucklanders. From the car park on Bethells Road, climb over the immense sand dunes or follow the stream around the edge to Lake Wainamu. Walk the lake's perimeter, jump off the jetty or scale the huge dunes.


